

CHAPTER 148. payment of any legal debts heretofore contracted by said borough, and, in like manner, to levy special taxes upon the property named in section second, for the payment of any legal demands upon the same, contracted previous to the passage of this act.

Ordinance relating to swine. § 11. The ordinance, with the amendments thereto, to restrain swine from running at large, heretofore passed by the council of said borough, shall remain operative, as to the first ward, but shall not apply to the second ward: *Provided*, That if, at any time, a majority of the trustees of said second ward shall make application to the borough council, in writing, to have said ordinance and amendments extended over the second ward, then said council shall have power to declare the same operative in said second ward, and to enforce the observance thereof.

How only taxes collected. § 12. No taxes for borough purposes, or for roads and bridges, shall be collected in either ward of said borough, unless the ordinance of said borough, directing the levy and collection of such taxes, shall receive the assent of a majority of the trustees elected for the ward in which such taxes are to be collected.

Limit of taxes. § 13. There shall not be levied or raised at any time, in said second ward, any tax for general borough purposes, buildings or improvements of any nature, more than three hundred dollars in one year.

Effect. § 14. This law shall take effect on the first Tuesday in April next, and all laws inconsistent with the provisions hereof, are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 148.

AN ACT to amend the Charter of the city of Appleton.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Council authorized to appoint street commissioner. SECTION 1. The common council of said city shall, at their first regular meeting after the annual charter election, appoint some suitable and competent person to be street commissioner of the said city. The person so appointed shall hold his office for one year, and un-

til his successor is appointed and qualified, unless soon-
er removed for cause by the council, and shall discharge
all the duties required to be done by the aldermen of
the several wards, by chapter eight of the act of which
this is amendatory, and by the amendments thereto,
and by any ordinances of said city that are now or
may hereafter be in force, and all the provisions of said
chapter, and of the acts amendatory thereto, and of the
city ordinances relating to street commissioners, shall
apply to the person so appointed.

§ 2. The common council shall, by ordinance, fix
the rate of compensation of such street commissioner,
which shall not be changed during his term of office.

§ 3. The expenses of repairing and maintaining
those parts of the roads from Appleton to Menasha,
and from Appleton to Kaukauna, and from Appleton
to New London, by way of College Avenue, as lie
within the city limits, and of repairing and maintain-
ing the bridges across the great ravine on Court street
and College Avenue, and such other bridges now or
hereafter erected, as the common council shall by or-
dinance direct, shall be paid from a fund to be known as
the road fund, and a tax shall be levied annually on
all the taxable property in the city, for the purpose of
such fund, and paid out by the treasurer only on orders
drawn expressly on said fund.

§ 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
and after its passage.

CHAPTER 152.

AN ACT to enable the corporation of the village of Sparta to construct
sidewalks, and otherwise improve the streets of said village.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in
Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows.*

SECTION 1. Whenever two-thirds of all the resident
owners of real estate bounding on one or both sides of
any street or part of street, not less than twenty rods in
length, in said village, shall desire to have such streets
graded, or sidewalks erected thereon, and shall make
