

CHAPTER 169.

AN ACT to legalize the assessment of taxes in the county of Walworth.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The tax list of the county of Walworth, and of the several towns of said county, for the year 1859, is hereby declared, and shall be taken and deemed to be, to all intents and for all purposes, as valid and binding as if the same were, and in all things had been, made out according to and in compliance with all the requirements of the laws of this State: *Provided*, that it shall and may be lawful for the board of supervisors of said Walworth county, and the said board is hereby vested with full power to correct any error or errors, which may have occurred in the tax list of said county, or any of the towns of said county, for the year 1859, and to provide for and require to be inserted in the tax list of any of the several towns of said county for the year 1860, any deficiency in the amount of taxes with which any such towns should have been legally and justly charged in the tax list of 1859, and any deficiency so as aforesaid added to and made part of the tax list of any town of said county, for the year 1860, shall be taken and deemed to be part and portion of the tax of such town for that year, and collected accordingly.

Declared valid.

Errors may be corrected.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
