

CHAPTER 256.

AN ACT to provide for the payment of money to the Waupacca County Agricultural Society for the year 1856.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

State Treasurer to pay Waupacca Co. Ag. Soc. \$100 in certain circumstances.

SECTION 1. Whenever it shall be made to appear to the Secretary of State, by satisfactory proof, that the Waupacca County Agricultural Society was an organized society in the year 1856, and that said society held an annual fair in that year, and that there was actually paid into the treasury of said society, for its sole use and benefit, a sum not less than one hundred dollars, it shall be the duty of the Secretary of State to issue an order to the State Treasurer to pay to the treasurer of said society, on application, the sum of one hundred dollars; which sum, so ordered, is hereby appropriated to said society, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 265.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Willard T. Chase, as Justice of the Peace of the county of Dane.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Acts of Willard T. Chase legalized.

SECTION 1. All of the official acts of Willard T. Chase, who was duly elected in April, 1857, as a justice of the peace for the term of two years, in the town of Bristol, in the county of Dane, are hereby legalized and made as valid during said term, as though said Chase had complied with all the requirements of the statute before entering upon the duties of said office.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
