

CHAPTER 276.

AN ACT to authorize the Secretary of State to audit certain accounts.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

Watchman in
Bank Comptroller's office—
Account audited.

SECTION 1. The Secretary of State is hereby authorized to audit, monthly, the account of the Watchman in the office of the Bank Comptroller: *Provided*, That such Watchman shall receive for his services no more than one dollar and twenty-five cents for each night.

§ 2. All acts, and parts of acts, contravening the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

§ 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 285.

AN ACT to grant a certain island in the Wisconsin River, in the county of Wood, to Orestes Garrison and H. W. Jackson.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Island conveyed on certain conditions.

SECTION 1. A certain island in the Wisconsin river, situate near the west shore of said river, and partly in section number eight, and partly in section number seventeen, in township number twenty-two, north of range number seven east, in the county of Wood, is hereby granted and conveyed to Orestes Garrison and H. W. Jackson, of said county of Wood: *Provided*, That the said Garrison and Jackson shall, within six months after the passage of this act, cause the said island to be measured and surveyed by the county surveyor of said county, (or of some adjoining county), and also, within the same time, cause a certificate, signed by such surveyor, to be filed in the office of the Secretary of State, describing said Island, and showing the number of acres, and parts of an acre therein contained.

§ 2. At any time after the certificate mentioned in section one of this act, shall be filed as above provided, the said Garrison and Jackson may pay into the State Treasury a sum equal to five dollars per acre, (and at that rate for parts of an acre) contained in said island; such number of acres and parts of an acre to be ascertained from said certificate. Upon such payment being made, the State Treasurer shall execute and deliver to said Garrison and Jackson, a receipt therefor, describing said island as the same shall be described in said certificate, and the title of said island shall, thereupon, vest in said Garrison and Jackson, and the said receipt shall be sufficient evidence of such title in all courts and places.

CHAPTER 286.

Five dollars per acre to be paid.

Duty of State Treasurer.

§ 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT to vacate certain lots of the town of the Island, in Winnebago county.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All that part of the plat of the "Town of the Island," known and described and recorded as lots 1, 2, 3 and 4, of block "C," and 177, 178, 179, 180, 181, 182, block "B," of town 20, range 17, in the town of Menasha, Winnebago county, Wisconsin, of which Henry Hewitt is the proprietor, is hereby vacated: *Provided*, That the vacation of said plat shall not vacate any street or highway laid out through or over said plat.

Town of the Island—Lots vacated.

§ 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
