

## CHAPTER 41.

[Published February 15, 1860.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter 114, of General Laws of 1859, conferring civil jurisdiction on the county court of Crawford county.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 114, of the General Laws of 1859, entitled "An Act to amend that part of chapter 117, of the Revised Statutes, entitled 'of county courts having civil jurisdiction,' and to confer civil jurisdiction upon the county court of Crawford county," is hereby repealed.

SEC. 2. All judgments heretofore rendered in the county court of said Crawford county, may be enforced, reviewed, or appealed from, in the same manner, and with like effect, as if rendered in the circuit court of said county, and execution or other proper process may issue thereon from said circuit court. All appeals heretofore taken from judgments of justices of the peace to said county court and undetermined therein, all actions now pending, or writs, process, or recognizances returnable to said county court, shall be taken to be pending in or returnable to the circuit court of said county, and said circuit court shall entertain jurisdiction thereof, in the same manner as if originally brought to, or pending therein.

SEC. 3. Nothing herein contained, shall be construed to impair or effect [affect] the lien of any judgment heretofore rendered, in said county court.

SEC. 4. All appeals from judgments of the justices of the peace, shall be taken to the circuit, instead of the county court of said county.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
