

CHAPTER 104.

[Published April 1, 1861.]

AN ACT in relation to printing Reports for the use of the Senate and Assembly of the State of Wisconsin, by the officers of the several departments and superintendents of state institutions.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Immediately after the annual reports of the several departments and institutions shall have been placed in the hands of the governor, he shall deliver them, together with a copy of his annual message of the preceding year, to the state printer, who shall proceed to print two thousand five hundred copies of each ; and the said state printer shall bind two thousand of each of such documents into two thousand volumes, so that each volume shall contain one of each of such documents. Five hundred of each of the documents printed in pursuance of the provisions of this act, shall be folded and stitched in pamphlet form, for the use of the departments and institutions furnishing such documents; and the whole of the above mentioned work shall be completed and deposited with the superintendent of public property on or before the second Wednesday of January in each year. One hundred of the volumes referred to in this section, shall be for the use of the state departments, and the remainder for the use of the legislature.

SECTION 2. So much of any act as requires the printing of the reports of any of the departments or institutions in any greater or less number, or in any other form, than is required by this act, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
