AN ACT to attach the territory hereinafter named to the town of Mount Pleasant, in the county of Racine, and to repeal Chapter 160 of the General Laws of 1861, entitled "An act for the organization of the town of Sagetown, in the county of Racine.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Territory attach-

SECTION 1. All that district of country included and embraced within the following limits and boundaries in township No. three of range twenty-three east, in the county of Racine and state of Wisconsin, to wit: The north half of section twenty-one, the north-east quarter of section No. twenty, the east half of section No. seventeen, the east half of section No. eight, the south-east quarter of section No. five, and the south half of fractional section No. four, being the territory detached from the city of Racine, by the judgment of the supreme court, is hereby attached to the town of Mount Pleasant, in said county of Racine, and shall compose a part of the second assembly district in said county.

Repeal.

SECTION 2. Chapter 160 of the general laws of 1861, entitled "An act for the organization of the town of Sagetown, in the county of Racine," approved March 30th, 1861, is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.
