CHAPTER 211.

AN ACT to amend section 44 of chapter 165 of the revised statutes, entitled "of offences against property."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section forty-four of chapter one hundred and sixty-five of the revised statutes, is hereby ^{Malicious injury to cattle and other property.}

amended so as to read as follows, viz.: “Every person who shall willfully and maliciously kill, maim or disfigure any horses, cattle or other beasts of another person, or shall willfully and maliciously administer poison to any such beasts, or expose any poisonous substances with the intent that the same may be taken or swallowed by them, or shall willfully and maliciously destroy or injure the personal property of another, in any manner, or by any means not particularly mentioned or described in this chapter, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail, not more than two years nor less than three months, or by fine, not exceeding five hundred dollars nor less than fifty dollars: *provided*, that in case such personal property shall not exceed the value of three dollars, such person or persons shall be punished by fine, not less than five nor more than fifteen dollars; and in such case every justice of the peace shall have concurrent jurisdiction in his own county, with the circuit court.”
