the salary of the county superintendent of schools of said county.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 81.

[Published February 20, 1862.]

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of Andrew Sweep, as justice of the peace in the county of Dane, and to allow him to file his bond and oath of office as justice of the peace, in pursuance of his election in the year 1861.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Official acts legal-

SECTION 1. All the official acts and duties performed by Andrew Sweep, as justice of the peace in the town of Fitchburg, in the county of Dane, state of Wisconsin, prior to the passage of this act, so far as the same are consistent with the general laws of this state, are hereby legalized and declared to be valid for all purposes, the same as though the said Andrew Sweep had caused his official bond or bonds, and oath or oaths, to be made and filed in conformity with the laws of this state.

Bond and oath ? may be filed, &c.

SECTION 2. It shall be lawful for the said Andrew Sweep to file his official bond and eath of office as justice of the peace, in pursuance of his election at the annual town meeting held in the town of Fitchburg, in the year 1861, at any time before the 20th day of February, 1862; and when such bond and eath of office shall be so filed with the proper officer, the said Andrew Sweep shall thereupon be fully qualified to act as justice of the peace for the remainder of the term for which he was elected to that office, at the annual town meeting in the year 1861, any law of this state to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
