CHAPTER 27.

[Published March 2, 1863.]

AN ACT relating to the delinquent state tax of the county of Douglass.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

\$1,000 remitted on state tax. SECTION 1. The sum of one thousand dollars, being a portion of the delinquent state tax due the state from the county of Douglass, up to the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, shall be discharged and canceled, upon payment by said county of the delinquent state tax due therefrom, less one thousand dollars as aforesaid: provided, that such payment be made prior to February 1st, 1864.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 28.

[Published March 2, 1863.]

AN ACT to legalize the acts of certain town meetings in the town of Lowell, in Dodge county, at which bounties were voted to volunteers in the military service.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Legalized.

'SECTION 1. The proceedings of a special town meeting of the town of Lowell, in the county of Dodge, at which a bounty was voted to volunteers, held on the twenty-third day of August, A. D. 1862, as amended by a subsequent special town meeting, held in said town on the thirteenth day of September, A. D. 1862, and the tax levied in pursuance thereof, are hereby made and declared to be legal and valid, to all intents and purposes, notwithstanding any errors or omissions in calling or conducting either of said meetings, or in levying said tax.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.
