CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to legalize a certain state road from Whitehall, in Trempealeau county, to Chimney Rock, in Jackson county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Boad legalized.

SECTION 1. The state road laid out by A. L. Sherwood, B. F. Wing and James Phillips, under and pursuant to the provisions of chapter two hundred and thirty-eight of the general laws of this state of the year 1863, entitled "an act to lay out and establish a state from Whitehall, in Trempealeau county, to Chimney Rock, in Jackson county," is hereby declared to be a legal and valid highway, to all intents and purposes, notwithstanding any omission or neglect of the said commissioners to file with the clerks of the boards of supervisors of the counties of Trempealeau and Jackson, correct maps or drafts of said road within the time provided by law, and notwithstanding the omission to forward to the secretary of state a certified return of the survey and plat of said road within the time provided by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.

AN ACT to provide for revising and publishing the rules of practice for the circuit court.
