

CHAPTER 285.

[Published April 18, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize the proceedings of the board of supervisors of Wood county, in the formation of the town of Sigel.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The proceedings of the board of supervisors of the county of Wood, made on the tenth day of January, A. D. 1863, establishing the town of Sigel, and under which the said town was organized on the first Tuesday of April, A. D. 1863, are hereby legalized and declared valid to all intents and purposes, as fully as the same would have been had all the forms and requirements of the statutes in relation to the passage and publication of such order, been fully complied with. Proceedings legalized.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 286.

[Published April 18, 1864.]

AN ACT relating to evidences in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All patents issued by the proper state officers for any school, university or swamp lands, or the record of any such patent, when duly recorded, as provided by law, shall be *prima facie* evidence in all courts and places, that the grantor therein had lawful title to the premises therein described, at the date thereof, and such patents or the record thereof, duly certified, shall be *prima facie* evidence of all facts therein recited. Patents to state lands, or record thereof, prima facie evidence of title in grantor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
