AN ACT to authorize Anton and Appolonia Klaus and Willard Lamb to build and maintain a dock and pier on the east shore of Green

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Anton Klaus and Appolonia Klaus, his May build dock wife, and Willard Lamb, are hereby authorized to build and maintain a dock and pier adjoining lots numbers one and two, in section fourteen, town twenty-four, range twenty-one, in the county of Brown, and extending nine hundred feet into the waters of Green Bay.

SECTION 2. The said Anton Klaus and Appolonia May maintain dock already Klaus and Willard Lamb are hereby authorized to main-built. tain the dock adjoining said premises, heretofore built

by Anton Burkhart.

SECTION 3. The said Anton and Appolonia Klaus Portions used by shall and may use, severally, the south one-half of the dock and pier mentioned in the second section of this act, and the said Willard Lamb shall and may use and possess. the north one-half of said dock and pier, inseverable.

SECTION 4. The said Anton and Appolonia are here-Dock may be exby authorized to extend the width of the said dock one hundred feet south, and the said Lamb is authorized to extend the width of said dock one hundred feet north.

Section 5. The said Anton Klaus and Appolonia To maintain Klaus shall always keep the roadway leading down to said dock or pier, open to the free use of said Lamb, and the failure or neglect on the part of said Appolonia or Anton Klaus to comply with the provisions of this section, shall cause a forfeiture of all the rights granted to said Appolonia or Anton Klaus under the provisions of this act.

SECTION 6. Nothing in this act shall be construed Certain rights to impair any of the legal rights of either said Anton and Appolonia Klaus or Willard Lamb, as to the ownership of the dock mentioned in the second section of this act, or to the title to the premises upon which said dock adjoins.

This act shall take effect and be in force Section 7. from and after its passage.
