## CHAPTER 888.

[Published April 21, 1864.]

AN ACT to legalize certain special town meetings of the fown of Deerfield, in the county of Dane, held on the thirteenth day of January and on the eleventh day of March, 1864.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The special town meeting of the town Meetings legalof Deerfield, in the county of Dane, held on the thirteenth day of January, 1864, and also the special town meeting held in the same town on the eleventh day of March, 1864, for the purpose of raising special taxes to pay bounties to volunteers into the military service of the United States, are hereby declared legal and valid for all intents and purposes for which the same were held, and all acts done in pursuance of the vote or votes of said meetings, by the officers of said town, or any of them, are hereby declared valid, the same as if the law had been fully complied with in notifying and conducting said meetings.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to vacate an alley in Rose's addition to the city of Beaver Dam.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The alley running through block six, of <sup>Vacased</sup>. Rose's addition to Beaver Dam, and running from Mary street to La Crosse street, in said addition, is hereby vacasted.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
