

CHAPTER 375.

[Published April 23, 1864.]

AN ACT to vacate a part of the village plat of the village of Burlington.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Public square
vacated.

SECTION 1. All that part of the village plat of the village of Burlington, known as the public square, located on the northeast quarter of section thirty-two, town three north, in range nineteen east, platted and recorded by Silas Peck, is hereby annulled and vacated, and hereafter the land upon which said public square was laid out and platted, shall be assessed and taxed in like manner as if the same had never been laid out and platted as such public square.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 376.

[Published April 25, 1864.]

AN ACT to amend chapter three hundred and ten of the general laws of 1860, entitled "an act to lay out a state road from Wausau to the state line north, and to make an appropriation therefor."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendment.

SECTION 1. Section (5) five of chapter three hundred and ten of the general laws of 1860, is hereby amended, by striking out the words, "for the term of five years," in the thirteenth line of said section; also, the words, "for the term of five years," in the 16th line of said section.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
