SECTION 6. The said company shall have power ^{Rates of toll.} when said bridge is made ready for crossing, to demand and collect tolls for passing over said bridge as follows: For any vehicle drawn by two horses, mules, oxen or other animals, twenty cents, and for each additional animal, five cents; for any vehicle drawn by one horse or other animal, fifteen cents; for one horse and rider, ten cents; for single horse or animal, five cents each; for horses, mules or cattle in droves of more than ten in number, three cents each; for hogs and sheep in droves, two cents each; for foot passengers, two cents each, except scholars going to and from school, who shall pass free, and all persons paying for fifty or more crossings at one time, shall be allowed to cross at one-half the foregoing rates. The said company shall keep posted up in a conspicuous place, the rates of toll allowed by this act.

SECTION 7. Any person or persons who shall pass ^{Who deemed trespasser.} said bridge either on foot or with any vehicle or animal, and shall refuse to pay the toll authorized by this act to be collected therefor, shall be deemed a trespasser, and said company shall have a right to collect said toll in any action of trespass, with full costs of suit, before any justice of the peace of the county.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 400.

AN ACT to incorporate the turners' association in the village of Menasha, Winnebago county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. John Schneider, John Plonner, Frank ^{Corporators.} Hammer, Wilhelm Tilke, Ernst Webber, Louis Brass, Joseph Sommer, Nicholas Faust, Peter Lauer, Andreas

- Name.** Kraus, Anton Kraus, Joseph Kraus, Anton Buhl, Wilhelm Klipfel, Friedrich Hutzler, and their associates, who have united themselves into an association for the purpose of healthy amusement, and for the purposes and privileges usually exercised by German turner associations, and all persons who shall hereafter become associated with them as members of said association, are hereby created a body politic and corporate, located in the village of Menasha, in the county of Winnebago, and known by the name of the "Menasha Turn-Verein."
- Powers.** SECTION 2. The said corporation shall have power to contract and to be contracted with, to sue and to be sued, to plead and to be impleaded, to answer and to be answered unto, to defend and to be defended, in all courts of law in this state, and shall have perpetual succession, and be vested with all the powers and privileges necessary to carry out and fulfill the objects of their association.
- Ibid.** SECTION 3. Said association may keep a common seal, and shall have power and authority to acquire, purchase, recover, possess, be seized with and enjoy property, real and personal, not exceeding in value the sum of ten thousand dollars; and the association may alter said common seal, and sell, rent, demise, convey or otherwise dispose of their real or personal estate at pleasure; also, to effect loans and borrow money for the use of the corporation, and to execute, sign, seal and deliver through their proper officers, deeds, notes, bonds, mortgages or other instruments on writing, as the case may require.
- Ibid.** SECTION 4. The said corporation shall have further power to make, adopt and establish for its government, a constitution and by-laws, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, and make such rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary to carry into effect the objects of said association.
- Board of trustees.** SECTION 5. The members of said association shall have power to assemble and meet at such times and places as may be agreed upon by a majority of the members thereof, or to hold such stated meetings as may be provided for by the constitution and by-laws; and the said corporation shall elect any number of discreet persons belonging to the said association, not less than three nor more than seven in number, as trustees, to

take charge of the real and personal property belonging thereto, and to transact all business relative to the investment and disposal of said property. And the said association shall have power to elect such other officers as may be necessary, and as may be provided for by their constitution and by-laws, and to perform all their business therein designated.

Other officers.

SECTION 6. It shall be lawful for the said corporation to prosecute [prescribe] the powers and duties of all its officers, except that are herein specified, and to require bonds with sufficient surety for the faithful performance of their duties by the said officers, and also to prescribe the terms of office: *provided*, that the trustees shall hold their offices at least one year, and until their successors are elected.

Duties of officers

SECTION 7. The property, real and personal, of said corporation, shall be solely devoted to the purposes and objects of said association, and all real and personal estate which has been or may be hereafter lawfully conveyed by devise, gift, grant, purchase or otherwise, to said association, or for the benefit thereof, shall descend, with all improvements and appurtenances, in perpetual succession to, and to be held by the trustees in trust for said association.

Descent of property.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

AN ACT to incorporate the Lutheran Evangelical church of Schleisingerville, in the county of Washington.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That George Kern, William Ise, William Kushaupt, A. Spannager and M. Grisgow, and their successors, are hereby created a body corporate, with perpetual succession, under the name and title of the "Lutheran Evangelical church," at Schleisingerville,
