CHAPTER 53.

AN ACT to amend chapter one of the general laws of 1858, entitled "an act for the auditing and payment of the postage of the members and officers of the senate and assembly, and state officers."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Auditing of accounts of bank comptroller for postage.

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter one of the general laws of 1858, is hereby amended, by inserting after [the] words, "superintendent of public property," the words, "and bank comptroller."

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 54.

[Published February 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to extend the time for the payment and collection of taxes in the town of Grafton, county of Ozaukee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The time limited by law for the collection of taxes for the year 1863, in the town of Grafton, in the county of Ozaukee, and for making return of the unpaid taxes of that year to the county treasurer, is hereby extended to the 15th day of March, 1864;

Extended to March 15.

and upon such return being made, the county treasurer shall proceed to collect such returned tax and to advertise and sell the land so returned by the town treasurer of said town for the non-payment of taxes therein, in the manner now provided by law.

SECTION 2. This act shall in no way operate to extend the time limited for the payment of the state tax by the treasurer of the county of Ozaukee. Not to apply to state tax.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 55.

[Published February 20, 1864.]

AN ACT to authorize the town of Grafton, in the county of Ozaukee, to issue bonds for the purpose therein mentioned.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The town board of supervisors of the town of Grafton, in the county of Ozaukee, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue bonds of said town to an amount not exceeding five thousand dollars, for a time not less than one year nor more than two years, drawing an annual interest of seven per cent., payable annually at such place as said board shall determine, for the purpose of paying bounties to volunteers only who shall enlist in the United States service. Town board may issue bonds to pay bounties to volunteers.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of said town board of supervisors to provide for the payment of the interest when due, and the ultimate payment of the principal, of any and all bonds which shall be issued under this act, and for that purpose the said town board of supervisors are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to levy, in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes for county and state purposes are levied, a tax on the taxable property of said town, for the purpose of paying all bonds and interest issued by said town under and in pursuance of the direction and authority of the aforesaid town board of supervisors.
