

CHAPTER 118.

[Published March 20, 1865.]

AN ACT relating to guardians and wards, and amendatory of section three, chapter 112 of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section three of chapter one hundred and twelve (112) of the revised statutes, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: "Section 3. If the guardian nominated by such minor, shall not be approved by the judge, or if the minor shall reside out of this state, or, being a resident of this state, shall be absent therefrom in the military service of the state or the United States, or, if after being cited by the judge, he shall neglect for ten days to nominate a suitable person, the judge may nominate and appoint the guardian in the same manner as if the minor were under the age of fourteen years."

In what cases judge may appoint guardian.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 114.

[Published March 28, 1865.]

AN ACT to enable the town of Empire, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, to raise money by tax to pay certain claims.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The qualified electors of the town of Empire, Fond du Lac county, Wisconsin, shall have power, at their next annual town meeting after the passage of this act, to vote to raise by tax, (to be levied upon the taxable property of said town,) a sum not to exceed nine hundred dollars, to be paid in liquidation of a certain claim of James H. Haight, chairman of the board of supervisors of said town, for moneys ex-

Vote may be taken on proposition to pay certain sum of money to James H. Haight.
