

CHAPTER 146.

[Published March 27, 1865.]

AN ACT to authorize St. Thomas Catholic society of Beloit to use certain lands for a cemetery.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for St. Thomas Catholic society of Beloit, in the county of Rock, to use for a cemetery all those certain pieces or parcels of land situate within the corporate limits of the city of Beloit aforesaid, which were conveyed by Vinton Lawler to Rt. Rev. J. M. Henni, the same being held by him in trust for the said society for cemetery purposes, and which are described as follows, viz.: As part of the northeast quarter of section thirty-six (36,) town one (1), range twelve (12), beginning at the line between ranges twelve (12) and thirteen (13,) fourteen (14) chains and ninety-four (94) links south of the northeast corner of section thirty-six (36;) thence in a direct line towards the northeast corner of the village (now city) of Beloit, according to the original survey of said village plat, nine (9) chains and ninety-two (92) links; thence south one (1) and one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) degrees west six (6) chains and fifty-two (52) links; thence in a line parallel to first line nine (9) chains and sixty-eight (68) links to town line; thence along said town line six (6) and one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) chains to the place of beginning, and containing six (6) and thirty-eight one hundredths (88-100) acres, be the same more or less.

Description of lands.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts in any way **Repeal.** contravening the provisions of this act, are, inasmuch as such acts and parts of acts conflict with this act, repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
