

of July 18th, 1864, and all of the acts and proceedings of the town officers of said town in reference to filling the quota of said town under the resolutions at said town meeting, are hereby declared to be legal and valid for all purposes, notwithstanding any defects or omissions in or legal objections to the notices, the time and manner of posting the same, the holding and conducting said town meeting, or to the disposition made of the money raised, or the orders issued under the resolutions passed at said town meeting; and that the orders so issued by the town officers of said town, in the hands of any *bona fide* holder, shall be taken and held to be a legal and valid claim against said town, to all intents and for all purposes.

SECTION 2. This act shall be deemed a private act, and shall be published immediately, and shall take effect from and after its publication.

CHAPTER 158.

AN ACT to legalize the official acts of N. B. Howard, acting supervisor of the town of Magnolia, county of Rock.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Act legalised.

SECTION 1. All the official acts of N. B. Howard, acting supervisor of the town of Magnolia, county of Rock, by appointment, from the twenty-fourth day of January, 1865, to the fifteenth of February, 1865, are hereby declared to be legal and valid, the same as though he had been duly elected to such office.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
