

CHAPTER 211.

[Published May 4, 1865.]

AN ACT to authorize the town of Watertown, in Jefferson county, to pay certain moneys to the families of drafted men and persons furnishing substitutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

How moneys raised may be appropriated.

SECTION 1. All money heretofore raised by tax in the town of Watertown, Jefferson county, for the purpose of paying bounties to volunteers, which remains unexpended, and all to be raised for such purpose in pursuance of a vote of said town heretofore taken, may be appropriated and used for the purpose of paying to the family of each man drafted under the last call of the president for volunteers, the same sum as said town is now authorized by law to pay to volunteers who shall enlist and be credited on the quota of said town.

SECTION 2. The aforesaid moneys may also be appropriated and used for the purpose of paying two hundred dollars to each person liable to draft in said town, who shall furnish a substitute and have him credited on the quota of said town, under the said last call.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
