

CHAPTER 24.

AN ACT to change the time of holding the general terms of the circuit court for the sixth judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

General terms. SECTION 1. The general terms of the circuit court for the sixth judicial circuit, shall hereafter be held as follows: In the county of Clark, on the first Monday of March, and the first Monday of September, in each year; in the county of Jackson, on the second Monday of March, and the second Monday of September, in each year; in the county of Monroe, on the fourth Monday of March, and the fourth Monday of September, in each year; in the county of La Crosse, on the fourth Monday of April, and the fourth Monday of November, in each year; in the county of Vernon, on the second Monday of April, and the first Monday of December, in each year; in the county of Buffalo, on the second Monday of May, and the second Monday of October, in each year; in the county of Trempealeau, on the third Monday of May, and the third Monday of October, in each year.

Return of process, &c. SECTION 2. All writs, process, services, continuances, recognizances and proceedings heretofore issued, made, taken, entered into or commenced, or which may be issued, made, taken, entered into or commenced in or from said courts of said counties, respectively, or either of them, and all proceedings pending therein or returnable thereto, whether by recognizance or otherwise, shall be held and taken as returnable at the terms mentioned in this act for holding the said general terms of court, respectively, in the said several counties.

Repeal. SECTION 3. All acts and parts of acts, so far as the [they] contravene or conflict with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
