AN ACT to enable the county of Calumet to obtain certain records therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

The register of deeds of the county of Register of & SECTION 1. Calumet is hereby authorized and required to procure obtain records of from the proper records or offices of the county of cortain deeds, mortgages, &c., Brown, true and exact copies of the records of all deeds, in Brown county mortgages and other instruments recorded in said county, which relate to or affect lands or real estate in said county of Calumet, and like copies of the original maps and lists of allotment of the Stockbridge and Brothertown reservations, in said county, and that he record the same in the book or books of said county.

SECTION 2. The register of deeds and clerk of the Authoritemies circuit court of said county of Brown, shall affix to such copies of the records and maps and lists of allotment in their respective offices, certificates under oath, stating that the same are true and perfect copies of the original records in said offices; and when thus certified, such copies, duly recorded, shall have the same effect as the original records: provided, that when any of such Cortain originals original records, maps and lists of allotment are no part to said register. of the records of the 'county of Brown, and the said register and clerk of said court of said county shall not deem the same necessary to be retained in their respective offices, they shall be delivered over to the register of deeds of the county of Calumet.

SECTION 8. The register of deeds of Calumet coun- compensation. ty, and the register of deeds and clerk of the circuit court of said county of Brown, shall each be paid from the treasury of the county of Calumet, for discharging the duties herein enjoined upon each, respectively, such compensation as by law he is entitled to receive for like services.

Section 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
