CHAPTER 18.

AN ACT to amend chapter 49 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to amend sections 1 and 4 of chapter 183 of the revised statutes, entitled 'of costs and fees.'"

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The second subdivison of section one Fees for sumof chapter forty-nine of the general laws of 1866, en. moning jurors. titled "an act to amend sections one and four of chapter one hundred and thirty-three (133) of the revised statutes, entitled 'of costs and fees,'" is hereby amended, by adding thereto the following: "provided, that for summoning grand and petit jurors, no traveling fees shall be received for more than the distance actually and necessarily traveled in summoning such jurors." SECTION 2. This act shell take effect and be in force

from and after its passage.

AN ACT to change the time of holding the general terms of the circuit court in the county of Waupaca, in the seventh judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That hereafter the general terms of the General terms. circuit court in and for the county of Waupaca, in the seventh judicial circuit in this state, shall be holden on the first Monday in January and the first Monday in June, of each year. All writs, recognizances and Return of other proceedings made returnable to the circuit court process, &c. of any of the said counties, shall be considered and deemed to be returnable to the terms of such court as

fixed by this act; and all continuances and notices made or taken to any term of the circuit court of any of said counties, shall be deemed to be made or taken to the terms of such court as the same are fixed by this act; and all motions and other proceedings noticed to be heard at any regular term of such court, shall be allowed and considered to be noticed for hearing at the regular terms of this court, as the same are fixed by this act.

Repealed.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved March 2, 1867.

CHAPTER 20.

[Published March 5, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide stationery and postage stamps for officers and employees of the senate, and also of the assembly.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The superintendent of public property is hereby directed to furnish to the chief clerk of the senate, the assistant clerk, clerks of the judiciary committees of the senate and assembly, clerk of the committee on claims, enrolling clerk, book-keeper, engrossing and transcribing clerks, sergeant-at-arms, assistant sergeant at arms, postmaster, assistant postmaster, four door-keepers, porter and fireman, each stationery to the amount of fifteen dollars, and postage stamps each to the amount of ten dollars; also, to each messenger of the senate and messenger of the lieut. governor, stationery to the amount of five dollars, and postage stamps to the amount of five dollars; and to the chief clerk of the assembly, assistant clerk, book-keeper, enrolling clerk, engrossing clerk, transcribing clerk, sergeant at arms and his assistants, the postmaster and his

Stationery and postage stamps to legislative officers and employees.
