

Copy of this act to be sent sheriff.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the secretary of state, as soon as practicable after the passage of this act, to forward to the sheriff of Milwaukee county a certified copy of said act.

Notice of election.

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of the sheriff of Milwaukee county, upon the receipt of the copy mentioned in section two of this act, immediately to cause notices of such election to be posted in three of the most public places in each town and ward in said senate district.

How election conducted.

SECTION 4. Said election shall be conducted and returns and canvass made as is now provided by law.

This act to be published.

SECTION 5. The secretary of state is hereby directed to forward a copy of this act to each of the daily papers published in the county of Milwaukee, and cause the same to be published in said papers each day until after said election.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 25.

[Published March 11, 1867.]

AN ACT to submit to the people an amendment to section 21, article 4, of the constitution of the state of Wisconsin.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, The legislature of 1865, by a joint resolution, proposed and adopted an amendment to the constitution of this state, being in the following words: "*Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring,* That section 21 of article 4 of the constitution of the state of Wisconsin be amended, so as to read as follows: 'Section 21. Each member of the legislature shall receive for his services three hundred and fifty dollars per annum, and ten cents for every mile he shall travel in going to and returning from the place of the meetings of the legislature, on the most usual route. In case of an extra session of the legislature, no additional compensation shall be allowed to any member thereof, either directly or indirectly,' " approved April 8th, 1865:

AND WHEREAS, The foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution of the state was duly ratified and agreed to by the legislature of 1866, and approved March 28th, 1866: therefore,

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The foregoing proposed amendment to the constitution of this state shall be submitted to the people at a general election to be held on Tuesday succeeding the first Monday of November, 1867, and if the people shall approve and ratify said amendment by a majority of the electors voting thereon, said amendment shall become a part of the constitution of this state. To be submitted at next election.

SECTION 2. The form of ballot to be used in voting to approve and ratify said amendment, shall be "for amendment to the constitution," and to disapprove said amendment, and against the same, "for amendment to the constitution, no," which shall be on the general ballot used at said election, and deposited in the same box, and all persons qualified by law to vote at any election in this state, shall be deemed voters on this question. Form of ballots.

SECTION 3. The votes cast approving and ratifying or disapproving said amendment, shall be counted and returned by the inspectors of the election in all respects as votes for state officers are counted and returned; and the officers now designated by law to canvass the returns of votes for state officers, shall canvass the returns on this question, at the same time and place and under the same regulations and restrictions now provided by law for canvassing and declaring the returns of elections for state officers. Canvass and return of votes.

SECTION 4. Within three days after the determination of such canvass, it shall be the duty of the canvassers to certify the result of the said canvass to the governor, who shall thereupon, without delay, make proclamation of the result. Proclamation of result.

SECTION 5. The secretary of state is hereby authorized and required to include the substance of this act in the notice of the general election for the year 1867. Notice of submission.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
