

SECTION 3. It shall be the duty of each and every clerk of the county board of supervisors in this state to whom copies of said list are so transmitted, to deliver or cause to be delivered to the board of registry in each town, ward and incorporated village in his county, on or before the day of their last meeting preceding any general election, one copy of said list, and to the inspectors of election at each election precinct in his county, at any general election, three copies of said list, which shall be posted up by said inspectors in conspicuous places at the polls of such election, for public inspection. Distribution of lists.

SECTION 4. A copy of said list, duly certified by the secretary of state, shall be *prima facie* evidence in all courts and places of desertion from the military or naval service of the United States, by the person therein named as a deserter from such service. Lists prima facie evidence of desertion.

SECTION 5. Any clerk of the county board of supervisors and any inspector of election who shall refuse or neglect to perform any of the duties which by this act he is required to perform, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be liable to a fine of fifty dollars and costs of prosecution for each and every offense. Penalty.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 68.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 164 of the general laws of 1865, entitled "an act to amend chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled 'an act requiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents.'"

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. Section one of chapter 164 of the general laws of 1865, entitled "an act to amend chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled 'an act re-

quiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents,'” is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: “Section one of chapter 40 of the general laws of 1861, entitled ‘an act requiring owners of certain machines to guard against accidents,’ is hereby amended, so as to read as follows: ‘The joints or knuckles and jack of the tumbling-rods of all threshing machines hereafter used in this state, except S. N. Taylor’s knuckle or coupling, patented February 16th, 1864, and except J. I. Case & Co.’s safety-knuckle or coupling, known as the universal safety-knuckle, and C. W. Yates’ safety-coupling or knuckle, patented December 11th, 1866, shall be securely inclosed in a box.’”

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 69.

AN ACT to pay mileage due to regents of the university of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The provisions of chapter 107, general laws of 1866, are hereby extended so as to embrace and cover the mileage of the semi-annual meeting of the board of regents of the university of Wisconsin, held in the month of January, 1866; and a sufficient sum of money is hereby appropriated out of the proper fund, subject to the provisions of said chapter.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
