

CHAPTER 8.

[Published February 26, 1867.]

AN ACT relating to reporters of daily papers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Entitled to \$19
postage stamps.

SECTION 1. Each authorized regular reporter in the senate and assembly for a daily newspaper, shall be entitled, during the session of each legislature for which he reports, on the certificate of the chief clerk of the house for which he reports, to ten dollars' worth of postage stamps, to be furnished to him by the superintendent of public property : *provided*, that no person shall be entitled to stamps in accordance with this section, as a reporter in more than one branch of the legislature during the same session ; *and provided, further*, that no officer or employee of the assembly or senate, or the clerk of any committee of the legislature, shall be entitled to the benefits of this act.

Appropriation.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient for the payment of the same.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 9.

[Published February 27, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide for the payment of clerks of committees.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Appropriation
to clerks judi-
ciary commit-
tees.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum sufficient to pay for the services of the clerks of the standing committees on judiciary of the

senate and assembly: *provided*, that the compensation of such clerks shall not exceed the sum of three dollars per day.

SECTION 2. The chairman of the committee for which such service has been rendered, shall execute to the person who performed the same, a certificate of the amount due for such services; and upon presentation of such certificate to the secretary of state, he shall audit and allow the same, and issue his draft for the amount upon the state treasurer, who is hereby authorized to pay the same. Certificates of service, &c.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 10.

{*Published February 26, 1867.*}

AN ACT to provide for evidence in certain cases.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Copies of any record, paper, file or memorandum made or kept in the office of the adjutant-general of this state, when certified by the adjutant-general having charge or custody thereof, shall be, in or before any court or tribunal, *prima facie* evidence of the matters or things so certified. Copies of records, &c. of adjutant general.

SECTION 2. The certificate of the adjutant-general certifying any fact, matter or thing relative to anything appearing of record or otherwise in his office, shall be, in or before any court or tribunal, *prima facie* evidence of the fact, matter or thing so certified. Certificates of adjutant general.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
