CHAPTER 92.

[Published April 15, 1867.]

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "an act to protect the hop-growing interest of the state, and indicate the size of boxes used for picking hops in Wisconsin," [chapter 29, general laws of 1866.]

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two is hereby so amended as to read as follows: "It is hereby determined that the standard size and capacity of all boxes used for picking hops in this state, shall be not exceeding three feet long, two feet deep and one foot and a half wide." Standard size of hop boxes.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 93.

[Published April 11, 1867.]

AN ACT to provide for the compensation of deputy clerks of the circuit courts in the respective counties in this state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In addition to the fees heretofore allowed to the clerk of the circuit court, there shall be allowed to each deputy clerk regularly appointed as such, the Per diem of deputy clerks of court, §8.
