

CHAPTER 115.

[Published March 9, 1868.]

AN ACT to provide for the payment of rewards for wolves, wildcats and lynxes killed previous to January 25, 1868.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

To what date
bounty to be
paid.

SECTION 1. Any person who has killed any wolf, wildcat or lynx previous to and including January 25, A. D. 1868, shall be entitled to receive therefor the same reward as though chapter 364 of the laws of (A. D.) 1865, and all acts amendatory thereof had not been repealed, and chapter 364 of the laws of 1865, entitled "an act for the encouragement and protection of the wool growing interests in this state," and all acts amendatory thereof, which were in force and effect on January 24th, A. D. 1868, are hereby revived and declared to be in full force and effect, so far as to apply to any wolf, wildcat or lynx killed previous to and including January 25, A. D. 1868.

How act con-
strued.

SECTION 2. This act shall not be construed to authorize the payment of any bounty for any wolf, wildcat or lynx, killed on or prior to January 25, 1868, unless proof of the killing of such wolf, wildcat or lynx has been made within the time and in the manner provided by said chapter 364 of the general laws of 1865, and the acts amendatory thereof.

Appropriation.

SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, a sum of money sufficient to carry into effect the provisions of section one of this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
