

upon any street or highway in such city, and the cost of which work or improvement has been or is liable to be assessed against any lot or parcel of land bounded by such street or highway, it shall be lawful for the owner of or any person having an interest in any lot or parcel of land bounded by such street or highway, and any contractor or his assigns having any claim against such lot or parcel of land for any work done or to be done by him upon such street or highway under or by virtue of any contract with the authorities of such city, to agree and settle for such work and improvement.

Release shall be entitled to record.

SECTION 2. Any release duly executed and acknowledged by any contractor or his assigns under the provisions of the foregoing section shall be entitled to record in the office of the register of deeds of the county wherein such land is situated, and shall be a full payment and effectual release and discharge of all claim of such contractor or his assigns against any lot or parcel of land mentioned therein, but not of any claim of the city for printing, surveying, engineering and other incidental expenses, and also of all claims against the owner of the same, or the city which may be a contracting party for such work or improvement.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from its passage.

## CHAPTER 111.

[Published March 22, 1870.]

AN ACT to appropriate one thousand dollars for the purpose of erecting a Turkish bath in the Lunatic Asylum.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Appropriation:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of one thousand dollars, for the purpose of erecting the Turkish bath in the State Lunatic

Asylum: *provided*, the superintendent of the said Lunatic Asylum shall deem the erection of such bath necessary or advisable.

SECTION 2. The bathing rooms shall be fitted up under the superintendence of the superintendent of the Insane Asylum. <sup>Who to superintend.</sup>

SECTION 3. This act shall be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 112.

[*Published March 25, 1870.*]

AN ACT to provide for the relief of the families of citizens of Wisconsin who served in the regular army of the United States.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Every citizen of this state who enlisted and served as a non-commissioned officer or private in the regular army of the United States during the late civil war or any part thereof, and who during the time of such service, had a family dependent on him for support, who was credited to the state of Wisconsin upon its quota under any call of the president of the United States for men to serve in said civil war, and the families of those who died in said service, shall receive the same extra pay as was given to enlisted and drafted men under the provisions of chapter 117 of the general laws of 1864, and chapter 416 of the general laws of 1865, under the same conditions, restrictions and limitations as provided in said chapters, and all the provisions of said chapters shall apply to and be construed to include non-commissioned officers and privates in the regular service aforesaid, excepting sections 12, 13, 14 and 15 of chapter 117 of the general laws of 1864, aforesaid: *provided*, that the families of those who died in said service, referred to in this act, shall receive no more extra pay than is provided in section 6 of chapter 117 of the general laws of <sup>Extra pay to soldiers of the regular army.</sup>
