## CHAPTER 79.

## [Published March 19, 1870.]

## AN ACT to provide for the admission to the bar of the graduates of the law department of the Wisconsin University.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. All graduates of the law department of Entitled to adthe Wisconsin University, shall be entitled to admis-<sup>mission.</sup> sion to the bar of all the courts of this state, upon presentation to the judge or judges thereof, certificate of such graduation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

## CHAPTER 80.

[Published March 28, 1870.]

AN ACT to amend chapter 114 of the general laws of 1866, entitled "an act to reorganize and calarge the University of Wisconsin."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section five (5) of chapter one hundred vection 5 and fourteen (114) of the general laws of 1866, is here-amended. by amended so as to read as follows: "The govern-Government of ment of the University shall vest in a board of regents university. to consist of thirteen (13) members, two (2) to be appointed by the governor from each congressional district of the state, as the districts are now constituted; and the state superintendent of public instruction, who shall be an *ex-officio* member of the board: *provided*, that the present members appointed from the state at large shall continue in office until the expiration of their respective terms."

SECTION 2. Section thirteen (13) of said chapter 114 is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "For the support and endowment of the University there are hereby appropriated: First, the income of the university fund; second, the income of a fund derived. from the sales of the two hundred and forty thousand acres of land granted by congress to the state of Wisconsin by virture of an act approved July 2, 1862, entitled "an act donating land to the several states and territories, which provide colleges for the benefit of agriculture and the mechanic arts," which fund shall be designated "the agricultural college fund;" third, all such contributions to the endowment fund as may be derived from public or private bounty. The entire income of all said funds shall be placed at the disposal of the board of regents, by transfer to the treasurer of said board, thenceforth to be distinct and independent of the accounts of the state, and for the support of the aforesaid colleges or departments of arts, of letters, and such other colleges and departments as shall be established in the University or connected therewith : provided, that all means derivable from other public or private bounty shall be exclusively devoted to the specific object for which they shall have been designed by the grantor."

SECTION 3. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
