

CHAPTER 280.

[Published March 25, 1873.]

AN ACT in relation to the courts of the county of Milwaukee.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter thirty-seven of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to amend chapter three hundred and sixty-two of the general laws of 1860, entitled an act relating to the Milwaukee county courts," (be and the same) is hereby repealed; and section five of chapter three hundred and sixty-two of the general laws of 1860, entitled "an act relating to the Milwaukee county court," is hereby revived, re-enacted and declared to be of full force and effect.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 281.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and fifty-five of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to codify the laws of the state relating to common schools."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section forty-eight of chapter one hundred and fifty-five of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to codify the laws of the state relating to common schools," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "Section 48. The said district board shall have the care and keeping of the school house and other property belonging to the district, except so far as the same shall be especially confided to the care of the clerk, including all books purchased by the districts for the use of any children; and the said district board shall have power to purchase a record book, in which the proceedings of the meetings of the district and of
