

CHAPTER 107.

[Published March 7, 1874.]

AN ACT relating to embezzlement by carriers, and amendatory of section 28 of chapter 165 of the revised statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section twenty-eight of chapter one hundred and sixty-five of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following provisions, viz: In all cases arising under this section, if the person accused shall fail to deliver any money, goods or other property, according to the directions of the company or persons owning the same, or having the legal control thereof, or to deliver the same to such company or person on demand, in either case such failure shall be presumptive evidence that such accused person is guilty of embezzlement or fraudulently converting to his own use such money, goods or other property in any and every county in this state into which or through which the same had been carried or transported, or had been directed by the company or person owning the same, or having the control thereof, to be carried or transported by such accused person.

Failure to deliver goods by common carriers, shall be presumptive evidence of embezzlement.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

CHAPTER 108.

AN ACT to repeal chapter 209 of the session laws of 1873, and to revive, with sundry amendments, chapter 430 of the private and local laws of 1870, entitled "an act to authorize the town of Ahnepee, in the county of Kewaunee, to issue the bonds of said town to aid in the construction of a harbor at the mouth of Ahnepee river."

The people of the state Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 209 of the laws of eighteen hundred and seventy-three, entitled an act to repeal chapter 430 of the private and local laws of eighteen
