

CHAPTER 175.

[Published March 21, 1874.]

AN ACT for the protection of the banks and shore of lake Michigan, in the counties of Racine and Kenosha.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Taking stone from lake Michigan prohibited

SECTION 1. Hereafter it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to take, draw or dig any stones, from the bottom or bed of lake Michigan, within the counties of Racine or Kenosha, within one hundred feet of the shore, measured from high water mark.

Penalty-

SECTION 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of the first section of this act, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than fifty dollars, and the costs of prosecution.

Jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. Justices of the peace within said counties shall have jurisdiction of all cases arising under this act.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 176.

[Published March 27, 1874.]

AN ACT to authorize John H. Redfield, his associates, their heirs and assigns, to build and maintain a dam, or series of dams, across Elk river, in Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Location of dam.

SECTION 1. John H. Redfield, his associates, their heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized to build and maintain a dam, or series of dams, across Elk river, on sections fifteen (15) and twenty-two (22), in township number forty (40) north of range number (1) east, in Chippewa county, for the term of twenty years, for manufacturing and other purposes.
