## CHAPTER 264.

## [Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT to authorize John H. Knapp and others to build and maintain a dam across Lightning creek, in Barron county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. John H. Knapp, Henry L. Stout, An Names of in-corporators. drew Taintor, William Wilson, Thomas B. Wilson, and John H. Douglas and their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby authorized to construct and Authority to maintain a dam across Lightning creek (so called) in section 24, township No. 34, north of range No. 14, west of 4th meridian, in the county of Barron; said dam to be constructed for hydraulic and manufacturing purposes, and for the purpose of facilitating driving logs down said stream : provided, said dam shall be Proviso. upon land owned by them or some of them.

SECTION 2. Any person or persons who shall will- Penalty for infully break or destroy said dam, or shall open the jury to such same, shall be liable to the proprietors thereof in an action of trespass, to the amount of damages done, in addition to the penalties already provided by law, to be recovered before any court of competent jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect from and after its publication.
