

SECTION 4. The said architect shall, at the close of each month, make estimates in detail of all work done, and materials furnished during said month under said contracts, and shall certify the same to the said board of trustees, and the said board of trustees, after having examined and approved said estimates, shall draw warrants on the state treasury for the said amounts, less such per cent. as may be retained until the completion of the said contract, and of the work herein authorized, and under the limitation provided in section one of this act.

Make estimates certify same to board of trustees.

When board of trustees to draw warrants

SECTION 5. No member of the said board of trustees or other officer of the said hospital shall in any manner, or at any time, be interested either directly or indirectly in any contract, or in doing any work, or furnishing any materials provided for in this act, and any such trustee or officer, being or becoming so interested, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) or by imprisonment in the county jail not exceeding twelve months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Members of the board of trustees prohibited, from being interested in doing work or furnishing materials.

Penalty for violation.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 345.

[Published March 24, 1874.]

AN ACT to repeal chapter 165 of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to provide for the visitation of the state's prison and the charitable, benevolent and reformatory institutions of the state, and all acts amendatory thereof."

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Chapter 165 of the general laws of 1868, entitled "an act to provide for the visitation of the state's prison, and the charitable, benevolent and reformatory institutions of the state," and all acts amendatory thereof, are hereby repealed.

Chap. 165, general laws of 1868 repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
