CHAPTER 78.

AN ACT to legalize certain publications ordered by the county judge or county court of Jefferson county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Special publications in German legalized.

SECTION 1. All notices printed in the English language, that have been heretofore published only in a newspaper published in other than the English language, by the order of the county judge or county court of Jefferson county, in matter of probate, are hereby declared legal notices, and as valid as if such notice so published had been also published in a newspaper published in the English language.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in

force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 79.

[Published March 3, 1874.]

AN ACT relating to the care of the insane, and amendatory of section 15 of chapter 102 of the general laws of 1871.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Commitment of the insane to county poor houses.

SECTION 1. Section fifteen of chapter one hundred and two of the general laws of A. D. 1871, is hereby amended by adding to said section fifteen, the following, to wit: provided, in all cases where, from any cause, said insane persons cannot be admitted to said hospital for the insane, then it shall be the duty of the county judge to order a commitment of said insane person to the county poor house, and in case there is no county poor house in his county, then he may commit said insane person to the nearest poor house of any county that may be willing to receive said insane person.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force

from and after its passage and publication.
