

CHAPTER 198.

[Published March 9, 1875.]

AN ACT to provide for certain improvements about the Capitol Park.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

**Appropriation

Proviso.

SECTION 1. For the purpose of paying the expense of grading and macadamizing with broken stone to the center of the streets on each side of the Capitol Park, the sum of six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500) is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, which sum shall be paid out and expended by and under the direction of the park-commissioners, under and with the approval of the governor, and all work to be done under this act, shall, as far as practicable, be let to the lowest responsible bidder therefor; and the compensation therefor shall be paid upon the warrant of the secretary of state, after the account or accounts therefor shall have been allowed and approved by said park-commissioners; the residue of said sum, if any, shall go to and form a part of the fund for the improvement of the capitol park; under the direction of the park-commissioners; *provided*, that the work on the part of the state shall progress no faster than the work performed by the city of Madison; and *provided*, that the sum appropriated by this act shall be raised from the tax of 1876.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
