CHAPTER 83.

AN ACT to amend section four of chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the revised statutes, entitled "Of trials in criminal cases."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section four of chapter one hundred and seventy-nine of the revised statutes, entitled "Of trials in criminal cases," is hereby amended so as to read as follows: "Upon the trial of any person or persons upon an indictment or information, which is punishable by imprisonment for life, the parties shall be entitled to the following peremptory challenges, to-wit: Twenty-four (24) of the persons returned as jurors, and no more, shall be allowed to the defendant or defendants, and the prosecuting attorney shall be entitled to twelve (12) peremptory challenges, and no more." Amendment.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with section one of this act, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 84.

AN ACT to discontinue a portion of the territorial road known as the "Token Creek and Fort Winnebago territorial road," in Columbia county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That part of the territorial road known as the "Token Creek and Fort Winnebago road," lying and being in section twenty eight, in township eleven, north of range ten east, being in the town of Lowville, in Columbia county, is hereby discontinued and declared vacated. Road discontinued.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
