

Payments of judgments, etc.

SECTION 4. At the annual assessment and collection of taxes in said city next succeeding the first levy of thirty-five thousand dollars, the city council shall levy and collect the remaining thirty-five thousand dollars of the tax provided for in section one (1) of this act, and apply the same to the payment of the balance of said bonds and coupons.

Levy and collection of tax to be conditional.

SECTION 5. Nothing contained in this act shall authorize the levy or collection of any tax, until a valid agreement in writing is made, either under this act or otherwise, pursuant to which the whole indebtedness of said city shall be liquidated by means of the tax authorized by the act; and none of the money raised pursuant to the foregoing provisions shall be paid out or disposed of in any other manner, or for any other purpose than therein set forth.

Certain liabilities not included.

SECTION 6. None of the provisions of this act shall be construed to apply to the city improvement bonds, or to the bonds known as the compromise bonds, issued since the year eighteen hundred and sixty-nine.

Authority of street commissioners.

SECTION 7. The board of street commissioners of said city shall have full power to carry out the provisions of this act, except the levying of taxes.

SECTION 8. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 94.

AN ACT for the preservation of fish in Brown's lake, in the county of Racine, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Fishing made unlawful; penalty for violation.

SECTION 1. No person or persons shall by hook and line, or other contrivance or device, take any fish from the waters of Brown's lake, in the county of Racine, Wisconsin, between the first day of November and the first day of April in any year, from and after the passage of this act; and any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this section shall, on conviction thereof, be subject to a fine, for each and every such offense, of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars, with the costs of suit.

SECTION 2. Justices of the peace, shall have jurisdiction to hear, try and determine all cases arising under the provisions of this act: *provided*, that the defendant shall not be deprived of his right of trial by jury, nor of his right of appeal, as in other cases. Courts having jurisdiction.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 95.

AN ACT to repeal chapter sixty seven, general laws of 1871, relating to the taxing of dogs.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter sixty-seven of the general laws of 1871, entitled "An act to protect and encourage the raising of sheep, and discourage the raising of dogs," is hereby repealed. Repealed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 96.

AN ACT authorizing the city of Manitowoc to issue certificates of indebtedness.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The board of aldermen of the city of Manitowoc is hereby authorized to issue certificates of indebtedness for the sum of three thousand dollars, bearing interest at seven per cent. per annum, in payment for a steam fire engine: *provided*, the amount of such certificates, including all existing indebtedness, shall not exceed in the aggregate, five per centum on Authority of board of aldermen.
