

to receive and collect from the owners of all logs, timber and lumber, passing over such slides or driven by the aid of said dam, as a compensation for keeping up and maintaining such dam, the sum of ten cents per thousand feet, board measure, the amount to be ascertained by scale upon the landing in the woods if there be one; if not, in any other practicable way; and the aforesaid persons, their associates and assigns, shall have a lien on all logs, timber and lumber run over said dam, or driven by the aid thereof, until the charges aforesaid shall be fully paid, which lien may be enforced in the same manner as the lien of laborers on logs, except as to the time for filing the petition for said lien, which may, under the provisions of this act, be filed at any time within six months after the last of the logs of any mark shall have passed over the slides of said dam, or be driven by the aid thereof. *Provided*, that said Johnstons shall, at all times, comply with the provisions of section two of this act.

Control of dam. SECTION 5. The control of said dam, the slides and gates of the same, shall belong to the said Johnstons, their associates and assigns, and be under their exclusive control, subject always to the provisions of section two of this act.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT to authorize the superintendent of public property to furnish stationery and postage stamps to the employes of the senate and assembly for 1879, and to make an appropriation therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation for stamps and stationery.

SECTION 1. The superintendent of public property is hereby required to furnish the present duly enrolled employes of the senate and assembly for the year 1879, under the chief clerks and sergeants-at-arms thereof, and to the duly appointed clerks of the committees thereof, stationery to the amount of five dollars each, and postage stamps to the amount of two dollars each.

SECTION 2. The superintendent of public property shall also furnish each duly appointed and enrolled messenger, employed in the senate and assembly, stationery to the amount of two dollars, and postage stamps to the amount of one dollar.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after his passage.

CHAPTER 114.

AN ACT to change the boundaries of the counties of Shawano and Oconto, and to create the counties of Marinette and New.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Township thirty north, of ranges eleven, twelve, thirteen and fourteen east, of the fourth principal meridian, is hereby detached from the county of Oconto and attached to the county of Shawano, of which it shall hereafter constitute a part; and townships twenty-eight, twenty-nine and thirty north, of ranges sixteen and seventeen east, are hereby detached from the county of Shawano and attached to the county of Oconto, of which they shall hereafter constitute a part.

Townships detached.

SECTION 2. All that portion of the county of Oconto, as so constituted, included within the following boundaries, to wit: Commencing at a point in the boundary line between the states of Wisconsin and Michigan, in the Brule river, where range line between ranges sixteen and seventeen intersect said boundary line; thence southerly along said boundary line to the mouth of the Brule river; thence southerly along said boundary line to the center of the main channel of Green Bay; thence southerly along the center of the main channel of Green Bay to the range line between ranges twenty-two and twenty-three; thence north along said range line to the southeast corner of section twelve, in township twenty-nine, of range twenty-two; then west along section lines to the southwest corner of section ten in township twenty-nine, of range twenty-one; thence north along section lines to township line between townships twenty-nine and thirty; thence west along the same to range line be-
