

said commissioners upon receiving such certificates of indebtedness for the amounts to be borrowed, after the taking effect of this amendment, shall use such amounts for the taking up of the outstanding bonds of said county of Wood, issued in aid of the Green Bay and Lake Pepin railway company, or any of them, which may be presented by the holders at such price, in the terms mentioned in section five of said chapter one hundred and forty-four, or prices as may be agreed upon, between the board of supervisors of said county and the holders of any such bonds, receiving for cancellation a surrender of the bonds so presented with all the coupons thereafter to fall due upon the same, and satisfactory proof that all the coupons previously due on the same, have been cancelled or have gone into judgments, and that such judgments have been entered satisfied.

SECTION 2. Chapter one hundred and forty-four of the laws of 1876, shall remain in full force except so far as the same is in conflict with or modified by this amendment.

CHAPTER 169.

AN ACT to amend sections three hundred and thirty-three and three hundred and thirty-four, of chapter twenty, of the revised statutes of 1878, relating to public printing.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Sections three hundred and thirty-three and three hundred and thirty-four, of chapter twenty, of the revised statutes of 1878, are hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 333. The executive officers and heads of all state departments, the heads of the different educational, charitable and penal institutions of the state, and of the state board of health and vital statistics, shall report annually to the governor. Such reports shall give all items of receipts and disbursements in full and in detail. The governor shall, as soon as any of said reports are received by him, transmit the same, or copies thereof, to

the commissioners of public printing, whose duty it shall be to strike therefrom all parts not actually necessary, in their judgment, to be printed for the information of the people as to public affairs, and to order the publication of the remainder in condensed form, as said commissioners may determine and prescribe. The part so stricken out shall first be copied in a book by the secretary of state, and then returned to the respective offices from which they originated; and shall there be recorded, and shall at all reasonable times be open for examination by the public. Section 334. In preparing said reports for the state printer, said commissioners shall give all items of receipts and disbursements in full and in detail, and such items shall be printed in solid brevier, and otherwise in the most condensed and economical manner practicable.

SECTION 2. All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 170.

AN ACT to change the boundaries of certain towns in Lincoln county, and to organize a new town.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :

Ackley.

SECTION 1. Townships number thirty-one, thirty-two, thirty-three, thirty-four, thirty-five, thirty-six, thirty-seven, thirty-eight, thirty-nine, forty, forty-one, forty-two and forty-three north, of range number ten east, and the east half of townships thirty-one and thirty-two north, of range nine east, shall constitute and be known as the town of Ackley. The town of Ackley shall hold its first meeting at the school house, on the southwest corner of section thirty, town thirty-two, range ten east, known as the Lloyd district, on the first Tuesday of April, 1879, and shall there and then fully organize pursuant to the general laws of this state. No notice of such first meeting of the town of Ackley shall be required, except that given by the passage of this act.
