## CHAPTER 17.

AN ACT to appropriate to the governor a sum of money therein named, for a contingent fund.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the governor of Wisconsin the sum of one thousand dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for a contingent fund. Appropriation,  
\$1,000.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 18.

AN ACT relating to the preservation of public health in Milwaukee county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section one thousand four hundred and eighteen of chapter fifty-seven, revised statutes of 1878, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: In any county containing a population of one hundred thousand or over, all the provisions of this section relating to slaughter-houses shall apply to all establishments and manufactories in which dead animals or any part thereof, or any of the carcasses or offal therefrom, are collected and converted into marketable products. Amendment:

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
