CHAPTER, 76.

AN ACT to appropriate to John Weirick a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation \$20.35. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to John Weirick, out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, the sum of twenty dollars and thirty-five cents, for money paid into the state treasury for license as hawker and peddler, for which the said John Weirick was not liable.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 77.

AN ACT relating to legal notices.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Pablication in Sunday papers.

SECTION 1. Any notice, advertisement, statement or publication, required by law or the order of any Section 1. court, to be printed or published in any newspaper, may be printed and published in a newspaper printed on Sunday, and such printing and publication shall be a lawful publication, and a full compliance with the order of the court or officer ordering such publication, the same, to all intents and purposes, as though the same had been printed and published in a newspaper printed on a secular day; and any such notice, advertisement, statement or publication that may by law, or the order of any court, be required to be published for any given number of weeks, may be published on any day in each week of such term, and if so published as many weeks and as many times in each week as may be required by such law or order, the same shall be as lawful a publication thereof, and as full a compliance with the order of such court or officer, as if the same had been printed and published on the same day of each such week.
