CHAPTER 135.

AN ACT to appropriate to the Wisconsin state dairymen's association a sum of money therein mentioned.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Apntop: iat'on \$500. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated out of the general fund, to the Wisconsin state dairymen's association, the sum of five hundred dollars.

CHAPTER 136.

AN ACT to provide for service of process on guardians in the cases therein specified.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Citation by publication.

SECTION 1. Whenever the judge of any county court in this state shall deem it necessary to require the appearance before such court of any guardian appointed therein, a citation to such guardian so to appear at a time certain may be served by publication, upon obtaining an order therefor, in the following cases: 1. When such guardian has absconded from this state, or keeps himself concealed therein, so as to avoid the personal service of a citation. 2. When such guardian is a non-resident of this state, or has absented himself therefrom for a period of one year.

Application for order to be based upon petitios. SECTION 2. The order for such publication shall be made by the judge of such county court. The application therefor shall be based upon a petition, duly verified and filed, stating cause for requiring the appearance of such guardian in said court, and an affidavit showing the facts required to exist, that personal service of a citation within this state cannot be made, and also the postoffice address of such guardian, or that the affiant is unable, after due diligence, to ascertain it. The order shall direct that service of the citation be made by publication in a newspaper, to be designated as most likely to give notice to the person to be served for such length of time as shall be deemed reasonable, not less than once a week for six weeks, and that, on or before the day of the first publication,
