CHAPTER 89.

AN ACT to amend subdivision three of section four of chapter six of chapter one hundred and twenty-three of the general laws of 1877, entitled an act to revise, consolidate and amend the charter of the city of Oshkosh, the act incorporating the city, and the several acts amendatory thereof.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision three of section four of chapter six of chapter one hundred and twenty-three of the general laws of 1877, entitled an act to revise, consolidate and amend the charter of the city of Oshkosh, the act incorporating the city, and the several acts amendatory thereof, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 3. To license and regulate the exhibition of common showmen, or shows of any kind, or the exhibition of caravans, circuses, theatrical performances, billiard tables and bowling saloons, to prescribe the amount to be paid for such license, and the time when such license shall expire. And to grant licenses for the selling of spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, and to revoke the same for a violation thereof, and the amount to be paid for any such license for the selling of spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, shall be the sum of seventy-five dollars per annum, except druggists, who shall pay for such license the sum of sixteen dollars per annum, and to prescribe the time when such license shall expire; and may require of all persons applying for license for the sale of spirituous, vinous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, a bond in such penal sums and with such provisions as the common council shall direct: provided that no person so licensed shall give away or sell spirituous, vinous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, on election days or Sundays.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
