CHAPTER 116.

AN ACT to prohibit the sale or use of toy pistols and other toy firearms.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to sell or use, or have in his possession, for the purpose of exposing for sale or use, any toy pistol, toy revolver, or other toy firearm. Toy pistol.

SECTION 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail, not exceeding six months, or by fine not exceeding one hundred dollars, or by both fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force in ninety days after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 117.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 63 of the laws of 1879 relating to property exempt from execution.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 63 of the laws of 1879 is hereby amended by striking out the word "fifty" where it occurs in the seventeenth line of said section and insert in lieu thereof the words "two hundred," so that said section when so amended shall read as follows: Section 1. Sub-division 6 of section 2982 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "a span of," where they occur in the second and third lines of said subdivision, and inserting the word "two" in lieu thereof, so that said subdivision when so amended will read as follows: 6. Two cows, ten swine, one yoke of oxen, and one horse or Property exempt from execution.
