CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT to provide compensation for completing the transcribing of the senate and assembly journals.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Money appropriated for transcribing journals. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Charles E. Bross, chief clerk of the senate, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars, for completing the transcribing of the senate journal for the present session.

SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated to E. D. Coe, chief clerk of the assembly, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of two hundred and seventy five dollars, for completing the transcribing of the assembly journal of the present session.

SECTION 3. The money hereby appropriated shall be paid by the state treasurer on the warrants of the secretary of state, which warrants shall be issued when the duties and labor herein provided for shall have been respectively performed.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 28.

AN ACT to appropriate to the governor's contingent fund a certain sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Governor's contingent sand. SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the governor of the state of Wisconsin the sum of two thousand dollars, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, for a contingent fund.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
