CHAPTER 111.

AN ACT to amend section 663 of chapter 36 of the revised statutes of 1878, entitled "of the county board."

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to
county board.

SECTION 1. Section 663 of chapter 36 of the revised statutes of Wisconsin for the year 1878, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 663. The county board of supervisors shall consist of the chairman of each of the several towns and the supervisor of each ward and part of ward of every city, and of each incorporated village and part of such village situated in the county; but if from sickness, or other cause, the chairman of any town board shall be unable to attend any meeting of the county board, either of the other members of such town board, to be designated by themselves (and if they shall disagree they shall decide the same by lot), shall attend such meeting and act as a member of such county board; but such member of a town board shall not be permitted to act as a member of the county board until the town clerk of such town shall certify to the county clerk the name of the supervisors so designated to represent said town. When the county shall consist of one town, the supervisors of such town shall constitute the county board of supervisors of such county. Nor shall any county officer, or deputy county officer be eligible to any office named in this section; provided nothing herein shall affect the power of the county clerk under section 665 of the revised statutes.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 112.

AN ACT to authorize Benjamin F. Fay and Ira Bisbee to maintain a boom in Kickapoo river, in Crawford county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows:

May keep up a
boom.

SECTION 1. Benjamin F. Fay and Ira Bisbee, their successors or assigns, are hereby authorized to maintain and keep up a boom, for the purpose of

holding stave bolts, ties and logs in and along the Kickapoo river, along the south boundary of lots number two (2) and three (3), in section seventeen (17), town seven (7), range four (4) west, Crawford county.

SECTION 2. The said Benjamin F. Fay and Ira Bisbee, their successors or assigns, shall leave a suitable passage for logs, lumber, ties or timber, so as not to obstruct the navigation of said river.

SECTION 3. This act may be altered or repealed by the legislature at any time after its passage.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 113.

AN ACT to authorize Hector C. McRae, Jacob Luengle and John Miller, their legal representatives and assigns, to construct and maintain one or more dams across Duncan's creek, at the city of Chippewa Falls, Chippewa county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Hector C. McRae, Jacob Luengle and John Miller, their legal representatives and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to erect, construct, repair, maintain and operate one or more dams across Duncan's creek, at the city of Chippewa Falls, Chippewa county, Wisconsin, in the northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the northeast quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of section six (6), township twenty-eight (28) north, of range eight (8) west; provided, said dam or dams shall not exceed twelve (12) feet in height above low water mark; provided, said dam or dams shall be so operated as not to materially or unnecessarily obstruct the natural flow of water in said Duncan's creek; provided, that the legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, amend or repeal the franchises granted in this act, whenever, in the judgment of the legislature, it is necessary or proper to do so.

May operate dams.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
