CHAPTER 87.

AN ACT to amend section 1 of chapter 3 of the laws of 1882, relating to the time of holding courts in the tenth judicial circuit.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Terms of court, when held.

SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 3, laws of 1882, is amended so as to read as follows: Section 1. The general terms of the circuit court for the tenth judicial circuit, shall be held as follows: In the county of Shawano on Tuesday after the second Monday in January, and Tuesday after the first Monday in July. In the county of Door on Tuesday after the third Monday in February, and Tuesday after the third Monday in July. In the county of Marinette on the second Monday in March, and the second Monday in November. In March, and the second Monday in November. the county of Langlade on the last Monday in March, and Tuesday after the first Monday in September. In the county of Brown on the second Monday in April, and the first Monday in October. In the county of Oconto on the second Monday in May, and the third Monday in September. In the county of Outagamie on the first Monday in June. and the first Monday in December. In the county of Florence the fourth Monday of May, and the fourth Monday of November.

Section 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 88.

AN ACT declaring Little Yellow River, in Wood county, navigable for logs, and authorizing the improvement thereof for log-driving purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Navigable for logs.

SECTION 1. The Little Yellow River, in the county of Wood, where the same runs in and through sections nineteen (19), twenty-nine (29), thirty (30) and thirty-two (32), in township twenty-one (21) north, of range three (3) east, is hereby declared to be navigable for logs.
